

2022-2023 Goals and Strategies for School Improvement

1. Continue with implementation of the South Carolina Teaching Standards (SCTS 4.0) model, allowing teachers to gain knowledge related to state expectations for student and teacher growth.
2. Continue the South Carolina Teaching Evaluation process with the use of Student Learning Objectives which are content-specific, grade level learning objectives that are measurable, focused on growth in student learning, and aligned to curriculum standards.
3. Continue collaborative groups to refine curricula as well as design formal and informal assessments that reflect the higher levels of the Depth of Knowledge.
4. Continue with professional development for teachers with the following trainings: LETRS for the Science of Reading, Waterford for ELA and Math, Letterland for ELA, and PBIS for school climate.
5. Plan and implement a 5th grade end of the year promotion program.
 - a. Field Trips, to explore and expose students to academically enriched activities that promote student learning and growth.
 - b. Dance, to promote and celebrate positive behavior and academic success.
 - c. Promotion Night, to introduce parents and students to the requirements for middle school and celebrate student achievements.
6. Develop department actions plans aimed at improving student academic performance, discipline, and attendance based on the analyses of assessments and PowerSchool data.
7. Continue to use the Measure of Academic Performance data to drive instruction and determine scheduling.
8. Continue using the MTSS model to implement an integrated data-based problem-solving program for social-emotional outcomes across content areas, grade levels and tiers using a SEL program. (Example, Harmony or Ripple Effects)
9. Continue to use PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention and Support) incentive program to reward academic performance, attendance, and safety.
10. Provide professional development opportunities for teachers in content, assessment, methodology, and technology.
11. Establish lines of communication with parents through School Messenger, Webpages, monthly Title One newsletters, weekly telephone calls, and conferences.

Curriculum planning and the implementation of standards-based instruction has continued to positively impact student achievement. A comprehensive testing plan for the 2022-23 was developed using data from state and district mandated tests: PALS, KRA, MAP, SC Ready, and SCPASS. Lake View Elementary uses diagnostic student data from MAP testing to design an individual learning plan for each student. Students work on their individual plan through the use of iReady, an online assessment and instruction program that helps teachers provide all students a path to proficiency and growth in reading and mathematics. Programs were also provided, with interventions, to assist at-risk students: tutoring, mentoring, and the 21st Century Grant (Save the Children In/After School Program). Lake View Elementary Schools' Title Once and the PTO provided several family nights to assist students and parents.

Lake View Elementary School serves students in grades 4K through 5th grade who have talents to be nurtured, cultivated, and developed. Mrs. Tamara Nance-Bethea is the principal. With a focus on rigor, relevance, and relationships, Lake View Elementary School will continue its commitment to enhance and improve the academic performance of every student. It is the #1 goal to give every student the necessary tools that will promote, encourage, and support academic and social growth.
