Dear Parents and Community Members,

The School Improvement Council has prepared this report to highlight Lake View Elementary’s accomplishments, to review student achievement data, and to identify goals set for this school year.

Each year, the School Improvement Council assists in implementing and evaluating the School Renewal Plan, writing the annual update, writing the annual Report to the Parents, and writing the school narrative for the annual School Report Card. During the spring of 2016, our students took the new SC READY state assessment in ELA and math. This new assessment was very different from the previous ACT ASPIRE and the SCPASS state assessments. One major difference was the writing portion of the assessment. Students had to write a text dependent analysis based on a given reading selection. In the past, students only had to write to a generic writing prompt that was not text dependent. In addition to a new state assessment, the new South Carolina College-and Career-Ready Standards are in place for ELA and Math. These standards are transforming instruction in the classroom and includes inquiry based learning opportunities across all content areas.

At Lake View Elementary, character education is woven throughout every part of the school day. Each morning begins with a positive character message from the school principal. This is followed by classroom community meetings while the students and classroom teacher eat breakfast together. Throughout the day, teachers foster integrity, respect, perseverance, good citizenship, and a strong work ethic in their classroom activities and lessons. Students are rewarded for demonstrating good life skills through the use of the Golden Rule Awards Program and the Terrific Kids Program sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Dillon.

The two-year "hiatus" on ratings, which occurred as a result of legislation passed by the SC General Assembly in 2014, is designed to allow teachers and schools time to adjust to new standards and assessments before a system is developed that merges the federal and state systems.

- Lake View Elementary School received an "All Clear" rating from the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) as reflected on the Annual Accreditation Report.

Profile of the South Carolina Graduate

Lake View Elementary School is helping students develop the World Class Knowledge/Skills and Life and Career Characteristics identified on the *Profile of the South Carolina Graduate* by teaching the South Carolina College-and Career-Ready Standards for English Language Arts and mathematics. Faculty and staff members are encouraging students to develop strong interpersonal skills, work in teams, and to persevere when tasks get difficult. Students are also being challenged to use critical thinking skills and to problem solve in real world situations.

Lake View Elementary Highlights

- New playground equipment was installed for the 4K/5K playground.
- Lead teachers and administrators participated in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) training. Problem based learning was incorporated to promote higher level thinking skills in our students. Lead teams also toured local industries to see how science, technology, engineering, and math are used on a regular basis in the real world so that teachers can prepare students to be college and career ready.
- Second grade teachers received book collections and curriculum guides from Duke Energy's Read for Success Program. Each collection contained 35 books for each classroom. The Media Center also received the same book collection so that it could be shared with everyone.
- Every second grade student received their own set of books from Duke Energy. The students got to choose 8 books of their choice to use for summer reading.
- Patriot's Point provided fifth grade students with two books to add to their own home library.
- Patriot's Point provided the fifth grade teachers with a website to use for free supplemental materials to aid in the classroom. Lessons were also provided for the students through a site visit to the school and through live stream.
- Sixteen teachers participated in an eight week Read to Succeed course for literacy endorsement. This course provided valuable knowledge for reading and writing instruction for early childhood and elementary teachers.
