The school goals had been set for SC PASS and therefore, there were differences in the test scores for ACT Aspire.

- During the 2014-2015 school year, Lake View Elementary was named the Best Elementary School in the county by the Best of the Best Reader's Picks.
- Lake View Elementary exceeded the state average on SCPASS in Social Studies.
- Lake View Elementary exceeded the average of elementary schools with students like ours on both the SCPASS science and social studies assessments.

Lake View Elementary Highlights

- An Individualized Instructional Plan was designed for every student through the Compass Learning Program, based on the students' MAP test score data. Compass Learning is a web based program, and therefore students can access their individualized plan at home.
- Students continue to receive a free breakfast in the classroom every morning. This ensures all students begin their school day with a nutritious breakfast and will enable them to perform at their maximum potential for learning.
- The library continues to conduct Library Late Night once a month. Parents and students may come in and use the computers to conduct research or check out books together.
- PTO Board Members are actively involved in school events and support many student and teacher activities.
