At Lake View Elementary, character education and positive behavior are promoted through our PBIS Rewards Programs. Students are rewarded daily for having integrity and respect.

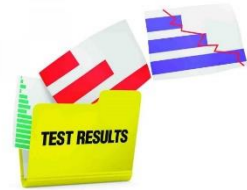
