Ready to Work (R2W) is a career readiness assessment system that measures "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment is given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information and Locating Information. Students earn customized certificates to provide future employers.
