## **Accomplishments**

### College Ready

- One Senior in the Class of 2025, was accepted into the West Point Military Academy.
- Sixteen Juniors scored 20 or higher on the ACT on the first attempt.
- We partnered with USC's STARS Program and the Student Loan Corporation to host two Financial Literacy Nights for students and families.

### **Career Ready**

- One Senior in the Class of 2025 was named state champion of The 2025 SC Skills USA Heavy Machine Operator Competition.
- We increased the number of students receiving OSHA-10 Certification. Students completed a 10-hour program learning health and safety protocols for the workplace.
- The Guidance Department hosted a college and career fair for students. Over thirty-seven vendors to include; colleges, military branches, industry, and various careers participated.

## **Academics and Extracurricular**

- Eight students received perfect scores on the Biology-I and/or US History End of Course Exams for Fall 2024.
- Over 285 students earned and have been recognized for the Honor Roll each quarter.
- 120 students are college and/or career ready based upon their achievement on the WIN Career Readiness Exam, ACT/SAT, ASVAB, and/or having earned six college credits through Northeastern Technical College.
- The Marching Wildcat and Concert Bands placed in multiple band competitions earning superior ratings.
- The Lady Wildcats Basketball Team are 2025 Class 3A Lower State Champions and 2025 State Championship runners-up.

# **Looking Ahead**

Ellen Weaver, State Superintendent of Education and the General Assembly has enacted a policy asserting that in 2030, 75% of students will perform at or above grade level. This is a part of the State Department's three priorities which are: Student Success, Teacher Support, and Safe Schools. Schools must meet the state's requirements for graduation, High School Success, and other indicators. This new policy requires 75% of students enrolled in courses administering End of Course Exams (EOC) to score 70 or higher to meet accountability. DHS' approach to reaching this goal and increase our report card rating are as follows:

- Support teachers in Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) to review content standards to ensure standards alignment and effective instructional delivery.
- Utilize assessment data to make instructional changes that address students' academic needs.
- Stay abreast of accountability measures/ changes to maximize the school report card rating.
- Strengthen the core instructional process to increase student comprehension, process skills, and transferal of knowledge
