School Renewal & Continuous Improvement Plans

The SCDE requires that schools develop a comprehensive plan to improve the academic performance and educational services for students. Dillon High School reviewed and updated a five-year School Renewal Plan with accountability elements for 2022-2027. The School Renewal Plan includes performance goals in four areas: Student Achievement, School Climate, Teacher and Administrator Quality & Certification and Professional Development. In addition, Dillon High School created goals for a Continuous Improvement/Turn-around Plan required by the state. The goals outline strategies to increase reading performance for Students with Disabilities (SWD) and methods to increase career readiness.

2023-2024 School Accomplishments

- The Class of 2023 graduates received over \$6 million dollars in scholarships and grants.
- Dillon High School successfully implemented daily, a 30-minute advisory period for students to receive academic interventions and support.
- The Guidance Department sponsored a sucessful college fair for students to attend and partner with over 45 colleges, military, and scholarship representatives. An overwhelming number of seniors applied to up to ten colleges at no cost to the students.
- Ninety-four students are deemed career ready based on satisfactory achievement on the WIN Career Readiness Exam offered to third year students.
- Dillon High School partnered with the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB), continuing to provide instructional support and coaching to teachers in English, math and science.
- During the 2023-2024 school year, Dillon High School increased its student participation in the Northeastern Technical College (NETC) Dual Enrollment program and the NETC summer program.
- The Lady Wildcats Basketball Team had an un-

- defeated season. The Men's Basketball team rank second in the region, and our varsity football team rank number one in the region.
- The Marching Wildcat and Concert Bands participated and placed in multiple band competitions and earned first place and/or superior ratings. Twelve band students also earned the opportunity to perform with the 2024 Region Five Honor Band Clinic.

Cognia

During the 2023-2024 school year, Dillon District Four underwent system evaluation seeking accreditation. Dillon High School, along with other schools within the district supported the district's effort by providing evidence aligned with the standards of the evaluation process. Major emphasis was placed on student engagement within the classroom. Observers sought to identify evidence of effective classroom environments that are conducive to student learning. Dillon High School staff, students, and parents participated in the survey and interview process on behalf of the district as a component of the evaluation process.
