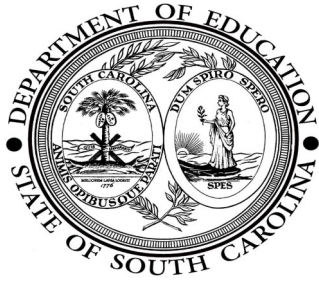


**FEDERAL ACCOUNTABILITY RATING

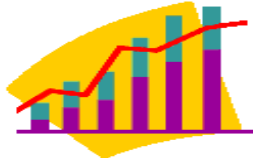

## Accreditation

Dillon High School maintained an "All Clear" rating from the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) during the 2018-2019 school year. The school was in compliance with all applicable standards in accordance with South Carolina statutes, regulations, and program guidelines.

## School Renewal Plan

The SCDE requires that schools develop a comprehensive plan to improve the academic performance and educational services for students. Dillon High School developed a five year School Renewal Plan with accountability elements for 2017-2022. It was submitted to the State Department of Education. The school is currently completing goals and objectives for the third year of the plan. The School Renewal Plan includes performance goals in four areas: Student Achievement, School Climate, Teacher and Administrator Quality & Certification and Professional Development.

## 2018-2019 School Accomplishments

1. Graduating seniors at Dillon High School earned in excess of 6.9 million dollars in scholarship money.
2. Focused on academic excellence for every student.
3. Dillon High School had a total of fifty-one students to earn the Life Scholarship and four earned the Palmetto Fellows Scholarship.
4. Provided service clubs such as the Student Council, Red Cross Club, Interact Club, and Anchor Club.
5. There were 32 Honor Graduates.
6. During the 2018-2019 school year, the varsity football team at Dillon High School won the Lower State Championship, and four of our band students were selected to participate in the 2020 USC Band Clinic.



Dillon High School is a Title I school. The purpose of Title I is to "ensure that all children have a fair, equal and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach, at a minimum, proficiency on challenging State academic achievement standards and State academic assessments." The program provides supplemental services to children in Title I schoolwide programs to improve the academic performance of students.

## Ready to Work (R2W) Assessment

Ready to Work (R2W) is a career readiness assessment system that measures "real world" skills that employers believe are critical in the workplace. The assessment was given to every South Carolina 11th grader with the exception of those eligible for alternative assessments. The assessment consists of three subtests: Applied Mathematics, Reading for Information and Locating Information.

## AdvancED

During the 2017-2018 school year, Dillon High School engaged in the AdvancED Performance Accreditation process to examine the institution as a whole. Programs, policies, cultural content, learning conditions and practices were examined. A set of rigorous research-based standards and evidence-based criteria was used. Dillon High School received full accreditation from AdvancED.
