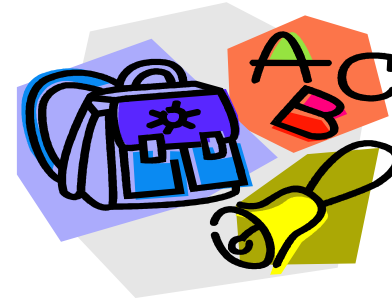

**2009-2010 SCHOOL YEAR ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

East Elementary School serves pre-kindergarten through third grade and is home to over 600 students who present a variety of abilities, economic and cultural backgrounds, basic needs, and learning styles.

Listed below are a few school highlights of which we are proud:

- Four tutors were hired to assist in the implementation of the Soday Reading Program for at-risk students.
- School programs and science kits were used to enhance the science curriculum.
- Parent Nights were held every quarter to showcase classroom activities.
- Universal (free) breakfast was available for all students to ensure a good start to each day.
- PACT Parent Night was held to provide students and parents with information about the statewide 3rd grade assessment that would take place at the end of the school year.
- The Soday Reading System was continued as an early reading/reading intervention program in grades K-3.
- DIBELS and DAZE assessments were used to track progress in reading for at-risk students.

**2010-2011 GOALS AND STRATEGIES FOR IMPROVEMENT**

- Technology integration will increase through the use of twenty-three Promethean Boards, one Activote and twenty-three document cameras.
- The Soday Reading System will be continued as an early reading/reading intervention program.
- Let's Play Learn will be used in 4K and 5K to better prepare those students for early reading.
- DIBELS and DAZE assessments will track progress in reading for at-risk students in kindergarten through third grade.
- MAP testing will be used to measure academic growth over time for our students. Students achieving the highest score or the most growth will be recognized.
- An "Awards Day" program will be held each nine weeks to recognize excellence in academics, attendance, and citizenship.
- Computers for parent use will be available in the media center.
- Parent training/workshops will be held four times per year to help with understanding class requirements, test scores, the Parent Portal found on the district web site and other pertinent information.
- Saxon Math will continue as an intervention for at-risk students.
