### 2020-2021 SCHOOL YEAR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

East Elementary School serves pre-kindergarten through third grade and is home to approximately 500 students who present a variety of abilities, economic and cultural backgrounds, basic needs, and learning styles.

Listed below are a few school highlights of which we are proud:

- Operated a two-day week (hybrid) and face-to-face schedule for the majority of students. Provided virtual instruction to five classes of students in 5K-3rd grade.
- Provided reading instruction using guided, shared and independent reading strategies.
- Completed daily math activities that covered concepts related to time, money, calendar skills and other standards tested on SC READY.
- Implemented both in-school (face-to-face) and after-school (virtual) programs with Save the Children (STC) through a 21st Century Grant.
- Participated in the USDA breakfast program to ensure that all students start their school day off with a nutritious meal.
- Purchased several picnic tables to allow classes to eat lunch outside.
- Participated in service learning projects to encourage students to help others.
- Conducted weekly grade level planning sessions for teachers to ensure coverage of state standards.
- Provided tablets for all students in Pre-K through 3rd grade.
- Recognized students for academic excellence at quarterly Awards Day Programs.
- Taught phonics using the Letterland Curriculum in Pre-K through 2nd grade.
- Hosted a Character Day program which allowed the students to dress as their favorite book character and share why they chose the character and what book the character is from.
- Held annual schoolwide100th Day Celebration.
- Hosted a virtual author's program. Jonathan Miller, a South Carolina author/ illustrator, explained what he does and why he writes about the topics he writes about.
- Published weekly classroom newsletters to inform parents of state standards being taught.
- Organized the distribution of Take Home Meals and Snack Bags for students from Love Feeds.
- Participated in the Waterford UPSTART Program into the 4K curriculum to improve student literacy and to strengthen parent engagement.
- Continued to participate in Tier I Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) Rewards Program across all grade levels.
- Began the MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Supports) implementation process.
