ACT 135 mandates that schools develop a comprehensive plan to improve the academic performance of students and educational services for students. South Elementary developed a five year School Renewal Plan with accountability elements for 2017-2022. It was submitted to the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE). The school is currently completing goals and objectives for the first year of the five-year plan. The School Renewal Plan included performance goals in four areas: Student Achievement, School Climate, Teacher/Administrator Quality and Certification/Professional Development.
