## Stewart Heights Elementary School School Summary Report April 4, 2019



The principal, Dr. Wendy Pace, and School Improvement Council members have prepared this Annual Summary Report for parents and community members interested in the school. The report reviews accomplishments made last year, as well as, test score data and accreditation information.

ACT 135 mandates that schools develop a comprehensive plan to improve the academic performance of students and educational services for students. Stewart Heights developed a five year School Renewal Plan with accountability elements for 2017-2022. It was submitted to the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE). The school is currently completing goals and objectives for the second year of the five-year plan. The School Renewal Plan included performance goals in four areas: Student Achievement, School Climate, Teacher/Administrator Quality and Certification/Professional Development. Planning is underway for a year two update to the five-year comprehensive plan and will be submitted to the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE). It will cover goals and objectives for 2019-2022.

#### Mission Statement

The mission of Stewart Heights Elementary is to ensure that all students have the skills to be successful by providing a highly qualified staff and a challenging, standards-based curriculum in a nurturing environment with parental and community support.

#### Profile of the South Carolina Graduate

Stewart Heights Elementary School is helping students develop the World Class Knowledge/Skills and Life and Career Characteristics identified on the *Profile of the South Carolina Graduate* by teaching the South Carolina College-and Career-Ready Standards for English Language Arts and mathematics. Faculty and staff members are encouraging students to develop strong interpersonal skills, work in teams, and to persevere when tasks get difficult. Students are also being challenged to use critical thinking skills and to problem solve in real world situations.

## State Accomplishments in Regards to Certification and Compliance

Stewart Heights Elementary remained in compliance with all applicable standards in accordance with South Carolina Statutes, Regulations, and Program Guidelines. The school received an “All Clear” rating from the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) as reflected on the Annual Accreditation Report.

### AdvancED

During the 2017 – 2018 school year, Stewart Heights Elementary engaged in the AdvancED Performance Accreditation process to examine the institution as a whole. Programs, policies, cultural content, learning conditions, and practices were examined. A set of rigorous research-based standards and evidence-based criteria was used. Stewart Heights Elementary received full accreditation from AdvancED.

### State and Federal Accountability Rating System

During the fall of 2018, the South Carolina Department of Education (SCDE) released school report cards, which reflect data elements and student performance data from 2017-18 school year.

In 2014, legislation was passed by the SC General Assembly to allow teachers and schools time to adjust to new standards and assessments before a system was developed to merge the federal and state systems. Schools that provide educational services to primary students did not receive a report card this year; however, report cards will be provided in the fall of 2019.

12. Increased technology integration through the use of portable mini notebook computer labs, mini notebook computers for all third grade students and the use of classroom computers.
13. Recognized students with good behavior at quarterly breakfasts.
14. Provided guidance lessons for students in kindergarten through third grade that focus on monthly character traits.
15. Published weekly newsletters to inform parents of standards being taught and quarterly newsletters with important school related information.
16. Provided *Family Game Night* to inform parents of activities that can be done in the home to help students with reading and math.
17. Invited parents to programs and conferences fourteen times during the year.
18. Invited parents to Muffins for Moms and Donuts for Dads Programs.
19. Conducted service learning projects to instill the love of helping others.
