

Review of 2016-2017 School Renewal Goals Accomplished: Curriculum

- *SRI data was used to analyze students’ needs and plan instruction.
- *System 44 and Read 180 instruction was implemented through the reading initiative and SRI score analysis.
- *Path Blazers Software was purchased to provide additional instructional support.
- *One reading intervention teacher was funded by the district.
- *Fourteen SRNS grants were received and used to enhance Science and Math instruction.
- *Teachers participated in staff development with a focus on the Read to Succeed program during early release days and various times throughout the year.
- *Provided teachers with relevant professional reading opportunities.
- *Fountas and Pinnell testing data was used to guide reading instruction.
- *One Reading Coach was funded by the Read to Succeed program.

School Environment

- *Surveys were used to determine staff development needs.
- *Staff development was planned and conducted throughout the year.

Home – School Connection

- *A successful Career Day was implemented.
- *Positive communication was sent home via: positive office referrals, positive notes home, clip chart discipline method.
- *The Student Council planned and successfully implemented several service learning projects throughout the year.
- *School Fusion pages were created for every class.
- *School website was updated regularly.
- *Robo-calls to parents were done regularly.
