# 2013-2014 Initiatives and Strategies for School Improvement:

# Goal 1: Strengthen parent communication.

In this area, the SIC worked to make sure that all parents have access to ParentPortal and can "like" SHS on FaceBook, a program that quickly gets announcements and celebrations out to our stakeholders. We promoted efforts to get information out to parents through details being posted on our website and through our ParentLink phone dialer. With the support of Spanish teacher Mrs. Elena Schupp, we implemented a program to send important announcements out in Spanish to our ESOL families.

# Goal 2: Increase parent involvement.

The SIC provided ways for parents to help celebrate teachers through gift cards during the winter holidays and during teacher appreciation week and through gifts for our teachers of the year. We also used our various avenues of communication to inform parents of ways to be a part of our school family through such events as parent information nights.

# Goal 3: Promote student leadership.

The SIC encouraged our student members, who are elected members of the SHS Student Government, to determine ways for more students to become involved at SHS. They responded by making efforts to more effectively and diligently advertise opportunities and to plan events that created excitement among our students.

# Goal 4: Increase school spirit.

The SIC tapped into its student members to attempt to create opportunities to increase school spirit, especially in athletics, fine arts, student events, and special support endeavors for our needy students and faculty. # Additional Strategies to Promote Student Success:

- Ninth grade students and atrisk students have an advisory period each day for tutoring and support.
- ◆ Credit recovery opportunities are provided for students who are behind in their classes or in the number of credits needed for graduation. This includes day classes in our APEX labs as well as classes in our evening school.
- ◆ Each department posts a tutoring matrix to inform students of tutoring opportunities before and after school.
- ◆ Teacher mentors are assigned to seniors identified as "at risk."
- ♦ School wide Student Improvement Plans have been created to encourage mastery of course content.

- Wrestling Coach Darryl Tucker was named Region Coach of the Year for the 3rd straight year, AAA Coach of the Year, & SC Coach of the Year by the High School Sports Report. His wrestlers won the traditional state championship by 36 points and brought home 5 individual state championships.

### **Fine Arts:**
