Our School report card reflects our steady gains in many areas, including more students meeting requirements for LIFE Scholarship, fewer students dropping out, more parents attending conferences, and a stronger character education program. ## 2011–2012 Initiatives & Strategies for School Improvement:

GOAL 1: To support the district and school goal of an 82% graduation rate. "Gold Cards" were given to students who scored high on both HSAP assessments "Gold Cards" have invigorated student efforts and resulted in 92% HSAP pass rate. Incentives included designated express lunch line, edible treats, and entertainment opportunities.

GOAL 2: To sponsor a "day of caring" to address needs at SHS. Nov. 19 was set aside as Day of Caring with PTSA volunteer group; ROTC; Leadership and additional Clubs on hand to support Fall Cleaning efforts. PLANT club followed with refurbishment of bold living Summerville "S" emblem in front yard of school.

**GOAL 3:** To sponsor morale builders for faculty. We sponsored a teacher celebration during our Teacher-of-the-Year program and during Teacher Appreciation Week.

**GOAL 4 To continue teacher appreciation efforts.** We will help to sponsor the annual Teacher Appreciation Week at SHS with donated gifts.

GOAL 5: To increase student and business partner involvement on the committee. Student involvement has increased dramatically with empowerment of Leadership classes. A Fall Pep Rally embracing the movement of all students to the off campus stadium was instrumental in creating student impetus for Green Wave Spirit. This event was the first undertaking of its kind in the state and corralled around support and effort of the school district, neighboring schools, transportation department, teachers, administrators and students. Public was invited to attend. The largest Homecoming Population met at the Pregame Bon Fire and Parade with the assistance of local businesses. Together we celebrated Summerville High Schools selection as America's Best Small Town High School.

GOAL 6: To sponsor efforts to place flat screen televisions in the cafeteria and hallways to showcase students and their accomplishments. Flat screen televisions have been installed with the aide of the PTSA. Daily announcements from WAVE TV replayed; student activities are advertised; student of the month is recognized; teacher pride is shared. Placement of TV's make consistent communication available to all students through student information and the Green Wave Cafeteria.

#### Additional Strategies to Promote Student Success:

- We continue to provide a Freshman Academy and various other teaming situations to promote student achievement.
- We continue to promote SAT/ACT workshops and honors, AP, and dual credit classes to prepare students for college.
- We continue to provide a variety of credit recovery opportunities for students who are behind in their classes or in the number of credits earned toward graduation.
- Each department on campus posts a tutoring matrix to apprise students of available help from teachers before and after school.

We continue to implement a full-scale HSAP and EOC preparation program involving year-long practice in a computer lab, incentives, and rewards to enhance student preparedness and attitude toward these programs. Teacher mentors have been established for seniors identified as "at risk." Expectations are to reclaim significant percentages of the identified seniors by May 2012. Ninth grade academy remains in place with improved efforts to continue 9<sup>th</sup> grade success. Implementation of collaborated discipline SIP's have been created to encourage student mastery of content.
