2015-2016 Initiatives and Strategies for School Improvement:

Goal 1: To improve aesthetic appearance of SHS: Each year, SHS continues to work on painting, repairing and adding more aesthetically pleasing designs and photos in the hallways in common areas. Some examples are large billboards listing last ten years of Valedictorian, Salutatorian and Student Body President. Displaying yearly 4ft by 8ft photo banners of our students in athletics / fine arts hanging in the main gym. School Emblems are also placed in hallways throughout the school. SHS is continually working to continue to add and improve the physical appearance.

Goal 2: To continue to increase student school spirit. Plans were developed and discussed to have split pep rallies were upperclassmen and underclassmen were separated to allow

all groups to fit in the gym and participate. Upperclassmen pep rally times were adjusted to earlier times and underclassmen times were later in the afternoon. Groups of spirit students led activities during events to support programs in student sections

Goal 3: To continue Teacher Appreciation ef**forts.** SHS along with its PTSA and SIC will continue its tradition of celebrating our teachers and increasing teacher morale by hosting a series of events during Teacher Appreciation Week. Scheduled events include breakfast for teachers in the principals office, different lunches for teachers, small gift packages for all teachers, and a "raffle" of gifts donated by SIC members and their friends, family, and the businesses that they patronize in the SHS community.

Additional Strategies to Promote Student Success:

- ♦ Ninth grade students have an advisory period during part of their lunch daily for tutoring. Upperclassmen students identified at-risk were also assigned an advisory period during part of their lunch to provide support.
- We continue to provide credit recovery opportunities for students who are behind in their classes or in the number of credits needed for graduation.
- ◆ Each department posts a tutoring matrix to inform students of tutoring opportunities before and after school.
- ◆ School wide Student Improvement Plans have been created to encourage mastery of course content.
