The History of Summerville Elementary School

Summerville Elementary sits in beautiful, historic downtown Summerville, SC. The school was built in 1954. It has been operating for 64 years and has only had 5 principals. We currently serve approximately 544 four-year-old through fifth grade students.

Our school became the first *Leader in Me* school in South Carolina and the 25th Lighthouse school in the world. Through this endeavor, Summerville Elementary launched our leadership model, The Art of Leadership. The goal is to create leaders of self by teaching the skills of self-discipline, self-reliance, and self-confidence. The faculty, staff, and students use Stephen Covey's 7 *Habits of Highly Effective People*.
