### The History of Summerville Elementary School

Summerville Elementary sits in beautiful, historic downtown Summerville, SC. The school was built in 1954. It has been operating for 67 years and has only had 5 principals. We currently serve approximately 504 four-year-old through fifth grade students.

Our school began the Ron Clark Academy House System last year to create a positive climate and culture for students and staff. All staff and students are randomly assigned to one of four Houses and meet one to two times each month to build character, relationships, and school spirit. Students are awarded positive points as incentives for good behavior, meeting goals, etc... Due to the Pandemic, adjustments to the program meetings and awarding points were made to meet social distancing requirements.

SES held monthly virtual parent and family events for the first time. All of these events have been very well attended and overall seem to be highly favored by parents and teachers. Future parenting events will include both face-to-face and virtual events.
