The History of Summerville Elementary School

Summerville Elementary sits in beautiful, historic downtown Summerville, SC. The school was built in 1954. It has been operating for 66 years and has only had 5 principals. We currently serve approximately 578 four-year-old through fifth grade students.

Our school began the Ron Clark Academy House System this year to create a positive climate and culture for students and staff. All staff and students are randomly assigned to one of four Houses and meet one to two times each month to build character, relationships, and school spirit. Students are awarded positive points as incentives for good behavior, meeting goals, showing school spirit, and going above and beyond both inside and outside the classroom.

Summerville Elementary also partnered this year with the Leadership Dorchester Class to raise funds and create a state-of-the-art STEAM Lab to be used by all students in K– 5th grades. SES hopes to lead the way by educating our students in STEAM opportunities in our community and for their futures.
