

ABOUT RMSA

Rollings Middle School of the Arts is a school for the artistically gifted middle school student. We serve approximately 800 students in grades six through eight. All students complete an application and participate in an audition process to select students for our core art areas of strings, piano, theater arts, visual arts, band, dance, and vocal music.

Our facility, which opened in August 2018, is state of the art with top-notch performing spaces, science labs, and spaces for collaboration. The school's new performing arts center is a collaborative effort between MeadWestvaco Corporation, Dorchester School District Two, and the Summerville community.

Rigorous standards in language arts and math promote career and college readiness. English 1 Honors, Algebra1 Honors, and Geometry classes are taught for high school credit. World language coursework includes Spanish 1. Dorchester School District Two students also earn a Fine Arts high school credit upon successful completion of their 8th grade arts core.

Our focus on the growth of artistic talent aligns with the development of world class skills for college and career readiness. Creativity is fostered through instruction on design and the opportunities for students to compose music, prose, and visual artwork. Critical thinking skills are developed as students synthesize and evaluate their performances and those of others. RMSA students use media and technology to create animations, movies, videos, and music.



POINTS OF PRIDE



We take great pride in the success of our students and know the foundation of this success is the collaboration of school, family, and community. In 2020, RMSA was named a National Blue Ribbon School. Schools are chosen based upon their overall academic excellence or their progress in closing achievement gaps among student subgroups. RMSA has also received many top achievements in local, state, and national artistic competitions. We look forward to even greater accomplishments in the future.

RMSA is a Project Adam Heart Safe School. Project ADAM Heart Safe School Designation is attained by schools upon successful implementation of a quality sudden cardiac arrest program of awareness, training and effective emergency response to promote a Heart Safe environment for students, visitors and staff as outlined within the Heart Safe School Checklist


Our RMSA school counseling department attained the prestigious Recognized ASCA Model Program (RAMP) designation. This esteemed recognition celebrates schools committed to implementing a data-informed school counseling program that aligns with The ASCA National Model: A Framework for School Counseling Programs. Our dedicated school counselors have demonstrated exceptional effectiveness in positively impacting student achievement, attendance, and disciplinary matters.

DETERMINED NEEDS AND GOALS

- The percent of walkthroughs/observations to include the Digital Learning Environment (DLE) will increase from 80% to 85% by the end of the 2027 – 2028 school years as measured by Classroom Mosaic.
- The ratings of student use of digital tools/technology for learning will increase from 1.81 to 3.0 by the end of the 2027-2028 school years.
- The percent of students in 6-8 at Rollings Middle School of the Arts meeting Fall to Spring Growth
 targets on NWEA MAP Math will increase at least 3% per year through the end of the 2027-2028 school
 year as measured by NWEA MAP Math reports.
- 4. The percent of Rollings Middle School of the Arts employees who have successfully completed the State Law Enforcement Division's (SLED) Active Shooter Training will increase from 97% to 100% by the end of the 2027-2028 school year as measured by Professional Learning (PL) attendance reports.
- The percent of teachers returning from the previous year will increase from 87.8 to 89.8 by the end of the 2027-2028 school year as measured by the annual SC Report Card.
- The percentage of students with disabilities suspended or expelled beyond 10 days will remain zero by the end
 of the 2027-2028 school year as measured by PowerSchool.
- The percent of parents satisfied with school-home relations will increase from 88.1% to 90% by the end
 of the 2027-2028 school year measured by SC Parent Survey data.
