-Currently, 717 students are enrolled in 4K-5th grades (555 students are in the school based model and 162 are in the virtual academy). -Average daily attendance for the 2020 school year was 96%. -In 2019, 83.1% of our 5th grade parents indicated satisfaction with the learning environment of the school, 80.5% were satisfied with the social and physical environment, and 74.6% were satisfied with home-school relations. -In 2020, 56.9 of the teachers at NES have advanced degrees.
