School Improvement Council Focus

School Wide Accomplishments

Social Studies Curriculum Accomplishments

- The 6th Grade Social Studies Team dove into a festive journey exploring Holiday's Around the World. Each student conducted independent research on the different countries around the world, learning about the unique holiday traditions and celebrations. Students then created ornaments inspired by their countries' flags that were proudly displayed at our Title 1 International Night.
- Mrs. Harris' class participated in a "secret Santa" gift exchange where students drew names at random and purchased/made gifts based on their secret pal's wish list. Each gift-giver was paired with someone they don't usually spend time with, making the activity a great way to build new connections.

Dance Team Accomplishments

- Danced at all home basketball games and participated in three state competitions. The dancers brought home 3rd, 2nd, and 1st place wins with their hip hop dance, and a 2nd and two 1st place wins with their jazz dance.
- The OMS Dance program hosted the Dancing with the Teachers event on Thursday, April 17th to raise funds for the dance program while showcasing the talents of many staff members who volunteered their time to dance with groups of students for the event.

Fine Arts Accomplishments

• OMS performing arts was represented at the annual DREAMfest Third Thursday event with the OMS dance program, OMS jazz band, OMS choral program, and OMS steel bands performing for attendees on Thursday, March 20th.

Media Center Accomplishments

- Used the summer to add casters to our bookshelves so the Fiction collection is mobile.
- Hosted the Library Ambassador, Little Librarians, and Girls with Gears Clubs.
- Helped students discover their "genre personality" with a quiz and book tasting.
- Taught students research skills, citation skills, and website evaluation skills.
- Created a reading nook thanks to the donations of friends and family of Mrs. Valildra Berry.
- Taught students about their digital footprint and how to be safe online.
- Taught students about different superstitions and showed them how to research using our databases.
- Hosted three poetry café events where students were invited to read their original poetry.

- Hosted all three 6th grade science classes to design and test their own Pinhole cameras.
- Taught our ML students about AI and plagiarism.
- Work with an 8th grade SC History class to research historical figures from the Revolutionary War and then create a script for their figure to be interviewed on a talk show hosted by the teacher.

Counseling Department Accomplishments

- Hosted the Be Pro, Be Proud Truck for 8th grade students. The Be Pro, Be Proud Truck allows students to use virtual reality to familiarize students with industries such as welding, construction, machining, automotive technology, etc.
