### 2012-2013 Initiatives and Strategies for School Improvement:

### Goal 1: Identifying and breaking down barriers to parent involvement.

The SIC tackled the task of identifying and breaking down barriers to parent involvement at Oakbrook Middle School. The number one identified barrier was communication of need. The PTSA shared that email addresses of all members were collected, but they needed assistance with putting the addresses into a workable format. Most parents in SIC shared that they were interested in participating in school events but simply did not know the need. A focus for 2013-2014 will be the promotion and use of Remind101 to share important information with parents, including volunteer opportunities.

### Goal 2: Improve school wide communication.

The OMS SIC was also interested in pursuing an examination of the school wide communication plan. Parents shared that the communication experience was dependent solely on the team of teachers that students ended up on and they felt that particular system could be improved upon. We collected best practices from the parents whose students were on highly communicative teams to develop a school wide plan for sharing assignments, grades, etc. with parents in a consistent and timely fashion. This plan will be finalized with team captains at the summer leadership meeting with the ultimate goal of providing a consistent, 6-8, communication system for parents.

## Additional Strategies to Promote Student Success:

- ◆ Specific students identified by teachers were supported in grade level after school tutoring led by Mr. Peters.
- ◆ A teacher leadership team developed RtI strategies to promote higher order reading and analysis skills.
- ◆ Teacher teams at each grade level manipulated time during courtyard, lunch, and related arts to provide additional academic support for students.
- ♦ Under the direction of our School Psychologists, OMS has continued the "Check In/ Check Out" program for behaviorally at-risk students.
- ◆ Student improvement plans are developed quarterly to provide direction for students to increase their grades.

### A Sample of Our 2012-2013 School Achievements:

- ♦ Oakbrook Middle School was one of 19 Dorchester District 2 schools to be awarded "Gold" status by the State Department of Education. The other 2 schools in the District earned "Silver."
- ♦ Oakbrook Middle School students have participated in and been successful in a variety of academic events and competitions, including Quest, Math Counts, Math is Cool, several writing contests, and Robotics.
- ♦ Through our service clubs and organizations, OMS students have participated altruistically in such events as Relay for Life, fund raising for the SPCA, Hoops for Heart, and Jeans for Troops day.

♦ Oakbrook Middle School began its first Student Leadership class with great success focusing on improving the hallways at OMS, providing ideas for different celebrations, and creating a fun and exciting yearbook.

### **Athletics:**

- ◆ Eagle Football won the DD2 Middle School Championship, finishing 8-0 on the season.
- ◆ Lady Eagle Basketball capped off an undefeated season with the DD2 Middle School Championship in January.
- ◆ Eagle Wrestling went undefeated in dual matches, capturing the DD2 Middle School Championship with a decisive, year end victory over DMS.

#### **Fine Arts:**

◆ Chorus and Band achieved a variety of Superior and Excellent Ratings in the Spring Festival events

- ◆ The Fine Arts Department collaborated on an \$18,000 grant that supported the production of the musical *Annie Jr.*, incorporating singing, dancing, and acting.
- ◆ Beginning in 2013-2014, Oakbrook Middle School will be offering a Steel Drums program.

### Career and Technology Education:

- ♦ OMS continues to be a district leader amongst middle schools in the use of the DoD online gaming program DimensionU, combining complex gaming strategy with math skills.
- ◆ Beginning in 2013-2014, Oakbrook Middle School will be adding a Gateway to Technology program that will eventually feed into the Pre-Engineering programs at FDHS and ARHS.
