MISSION STATEMENT

Gregg Middle School exists to provide an environment that is safe and conducive to learning. Together, every day and in every way, we help all students reach their potential in all aspects of learning.

The Gregg Middle School community will provide a safe, structured learning environment to promote high expectations for student achievement and character development to encourage success.

SCHOOL HISTORY

Gregg was originally built in 1974 to serve as the ninth and tenth grade campus of Summerville High School in Summerville, South Carolina. The school was named after Mr. John W. Gregg. Mr. Gregg dedicated his life to public education after graduating from Claflin College where he received his Bachelors of Science and South Carolina State University where he received his Masters of Science. He was a teacher and principal at Alston Middle School from 1970 to 1974. He later served on the administration team and as an assistant principal at Summerville High School. Unfortunately, injuries he sustained in an auto accident forced him into early retirement. In his honor, this school was dedicated to him on September 25, 1988, almost one year after he passed away.

In 1997, after additions were completed at Summerville High School which would allow for 9th through 12th graders to be on the same campus, Gregg was renovated and officially became Gregg Middle School, home of the Mustangs. In the summer of 2014, more renovations were completed

on the Gregg Middle School Campus, including a state-of-the-art Front Entrance and Welcome Center, new roofing, and air conditioning in the Gymnasium. As the largest middle school in Dorchester School District Two, we currently serve approximately 1,200 6th through 8th graders, while maintaining a student-centered learning environment that supports individual student needs and promotes a family atmosphere.

In March of 2015, after intense competition among the 256 middle schools across the state, Gregg Middle School was named Palmetto's Finest Middle School.

- GMS Multilingual Learner Classes worked on Cultural Exploration Projects to be able to share their culture through presentations by collecting data on cultural aspects of their country, specifically dance.

- Hosted Veterans Day Program produced by school counseling and the fine and performing arts teams, honoring our local community Veterans. Guest Speaker Matthew Scheulen United States Air Force.
- MAP Incentive Parties to celebrate academic growth of our students, Food Trucks, Snacks, Jump Castles, Music, other Activities.
- Held Reality Town with over 60 community volunteers who assisted with exposing our 8th
 graders to budgeting a monthly income and prioritizing their needs and wants to better prepare
 them for the real world. Students took on the life of a 30-year-old with a career based off of
 interest and GPAs. SHS leadership students led middle school students through activities in
 their classrooms to help prepare for high school.
- Continuation of Beacons and Leading Ladies mentoring groups, these students met regularly throughout the year with their adult community mentors.

- Added books to the library collection to meet the state's book-per-student requirement.
- Collaborated with teachers in every grade to develop information literacy skills and support the curriculum through class visits and instruction.
- Created literacy-based lessons to encourage reading various genres of literature.
- Created makerspace stations throughout the library for students to work collaboratively and creatively.
- Implemented the Beanstack reading program to encourage reading.
