Purpose:

This report from the School Improvement Council presents North Augusta Elementary's accomplishments and progress toward goals established in the 2014-2019 School Renewal Plan.

Goal 1: Increase Student Achievement

- North Augusta Elementary received an ESEA grade of 92.7/ A.
- On the 2014 School Report Card, North Augusta Elementary received an Absolute Rating of "Excellent" and a Growth Rating of "Average." .
- The school used Dominie, Compass Learning , PASS and MAP data to monitor and guide instruction.
- To boost student achievement in all areas, NAE utilized the District Literacy Model to instruct students during the daily 90-minute uninterrupted reading block.
- Math/Science Day, Career Day, and International Day were held as extension of the curriculum to involve parents and the community in the NAE.instructional program.
- Reading Recovery instruction was provided to first grade students who needed additional assistance in reading.
- A School Intervention Team met monthly to support teachers in analyzing school and class-level achievement data and suggesting interventions for students that were struggling in academics or behavior.
- SMARTBoards were utilized in all classrooms across the curriculum.
- A certified tutor was hired to enhance reading instruction with struggling readers.
- New technology was purchased to upgrade and replace the existing computer lab for students.

Goal 2: Increase Teacher Quality

- Teachers attend professional development activities throughout the school year, including scheduled activities during early release days.
- Reading teachers participate in Dominie training on administering and analyzing the assessment and its results.
- Teachers and administration review MAP and Dominie data to plan lessons and staff development needs.

Goal 3: Improve School Climate

- Quarterly ribbon ceremonies were held to recognize student achievement during the nine weeks grading periods.
- The school web-site and school Facebook page are maintained and parents receive a weekly newsletter with important information about upcoming events and instructional programs.
- The principal uses the Blackboard Connect phone call system to relay important reminders to parents weekly throughout the school year.
- Parents were given access to the PowerSchool Parent Portal allowing them to access student's grades and attendance information.
- Day and evening events were held to increase parent involvement in school activities.
- SIC implemented the Real Men Read Program.
- Students were honored for achievements and excellent behavior through Positive Office Referrals. Students received certificates and pencils at school. Postcards were mailed home to parents.
- On the 2014 School Report Card Survey, 95% of parents agreed or strongly agreed that they were pleased with the learning environment at school, and 93% agreed or strongly agreed that they were satisfied with the physical environment at school.
