Goal 1: Increase Student Achievement

The school used Fountas & Pinnell, Fastbridge, and MAP to monitor and guide instruction.

Computer assisted instruction provides every student a personalized learning path.

A School Intervention Team met regularly to support teachers in analyzing school and class-level achievement data.

All classroom teachers use small group intervention to supplement reading instruction with struggling readers.

ACPSD purchased laptop computers for students making us 1:1 in Kindergarten-5th grades to replace the existing computer labs.

Goal 2: Increase Teacher Quality

Teachers attend professional development activities throughout the school year including weekly PLC meetings.

Reading teachers participate in Fountas & Pinnell and reading intervention trainings on administering and analyzing the assessments and results.

Goal 3: Improve School Climate

Parent Liaison, Mrs. Cathy Brunson acts as an active link between the school, parents, and the community.

The school's website and school Facebook page are maintained and parents receive a weekly newsletter filled with important information. Parents are given access to the PowerSchool Parent Portal allowing them to access their student's grades and attendance information.
