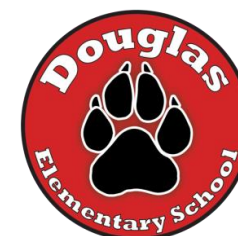
## **Celebrate With Us**

## SIC Annual Goals

**Academic Excellence:** This year, we have been able to implement Quarterly Honor Roll celebrations.
