Our Journey

Being Named a Leader in Me Lighthouse School

This year, was an exciting year for us and was one that ended with us being honored with this amazing title! Our journey started 5 years ago, and it has been one of the best decisions we made, not only our students, but for ourselves as well. To begin with, we received training each year in the following areas: 7 Habits, Launching Leadership, Climate and Culture, and Aligning Academics. Amd Empowering InstructionThroughout the past 5 years, we have established systems in our school that promoted student and adult accountability and leadership in personal growth, academic growth, and social/emotional growth.

In April, Lighthouse Reviewers visited our school and had the task of evaluating our leadership systems that dealt with all of the things mentioned above. They spent the day observing in classrooms, chatting with the Student Lighthouse Team, the Faculty Lighthouse Team, students, teachers, and parents. They also met with the Student Lighthouse Team to discuss their role in the school with systems, service projects, events, etc...At the end of the day, the reviewers met with the faculty Lighthouse Team to give us their Plus/Deltas. We got feedback through this process the will help us move forward. The reviewers then passed along their findings to a committee with the Franklin Covey Leadership. Two weeks later, we were contacted by our LiM coach and were told we had been named A Lighthouse School, one of few in our state!

Again, this year, we have offered this class. It targets students in grades 3,4, and 5. The class is organized into 3 stations which include small group guided reading with the teacher, a blended learning technology component, and an independent reading station. We have seen phenomenal growth with our students. They are assessed three times a year, and we are seeing great gains in reading comprehension, vocabulary, and reading fluency. There is a phonics component that accompanies the core curriculum as well. All of our students who have attended have been amazed at their personal growth and progress. The class also involves goal setting and tracking data which follows right along with our school data systems already in place!
