A Message from the Principal

W. E. Parker Elementary School is helping all students to develop the world class skills and life and career characteristics of the Profile of the South Carolina Graduate by providing a safe, caring and academically challenging environment where all students are encouraged as indicated by our motto, to "Imagine it, Dream it, and Make it Come True." Students are challenged to strive to do their personal best each and every day. Focusing on positive behavior, our students are taught what respect for themselves, others, property and learning looks and sounds like, and how developing these skills will help them to be successful both now and in the future.

Research suggests that the single most important factor in influencing student achievement is the teacher. All of our teachers are highly qualified, dedicated teachers who believe in meeting the needs of each child. Led by our master and mentor teachers, professional development focused on our school's need for improvement is provided weekly. Our literacy coach assists our teachers in improving our school wide literacy program through model lessons and related professional development. As a result of the TAP and the R2Succeed initiatives, our teachers are speaking a common academic language.

To meet the diverse academic needs of our students, three resource teachers, a gifted and talented teacher, a media specialist, two reading recovery teachers and a RTI specialist provide additional support services. Students also receive two periods per week of Success Maker, a computer-assisted program that provides prescriptive instruction for students after a placement test. Other computer based resources include Reading Eggs, Study Island, Fastt Math and Math Seeds.

Over the last three years, W. E. Parker has been climbing the ladder of success. This year we received the Palmetto Silver Award for closing the achievement gap. We also received the Palmetto Gold Award for our absolute rating of Excellent on the SC School Report Card.

At W. E. Parker Elementary, we will continue to monitor our programs and make changes as necessary to insure that our students receive the best education possible with the staffing and funding that we are provided.
