A Message from the Principal

At W. E. Parker Elementary School, we are growing world-class citizens by engaging, empowering, and enriching all learners. Our school culture reflects this purpose and supports our beliefs that students learn best in a safe, nurturing environment where respect for self, others, property and learning permeates. By building positive relationships with our stakeholders, there is a common trust and assurance that our professional staff will meet each child's social, emotional, and academic needs.

W. E. Parker Elementary embodies its purpose through a variety of support services provided to enrich the emotional and academic needs of its students. Instruction is integrated through reading as much as possible and units culminate with a project. Teachers meet the individual needs of students through small group instruction tailored to the student's instructional level. An enrichment period provides specialized instruction to serve those needing accelerated learning or additional support to achieve success. Additional services are provided through programs such as Gifted and Talented, Exceptional Children, Response to Intervention, and S.H.A.R.E. Several of our students have community mentors who support them weekly. In addition, referrals are made to outside agencies when additional support is needed to ensure that students have the tools necessary to become empowered and engaged in their learning.

All students participate one week per month in STEM Academy providing them with additional engaging and enriching activities. Third through fifth grade students have the opportunity to participate in an after school computer science program called Code Academy. Stephen Covey's, 7 Habits curriculum is utilized during classroom guidance and addresses characteristics needed to meet the challenges of the future.

The professionalism of our staff working diligently to meet the ever-changing needs of each individual child, regardless of their diverse background, is prevalent in our school. From the cafeteria staff, custodians, teachers, and administrators, we all share in creating a culture where children are free to take risks, are challenged, and are loved. Everyone believes in our purpose, which is to grow world-class citizens by engaging, empowering, and enriching all learners.

Areas of Notable Achievement in Student Achievement

Based on the last three years, our students have exceeded the district and state in all content areas on the SC PASS, ACT Aspire, and SC Ready. Our students have increased for met and above each year for both subjects assessed on SC PASS. Due to the changes in state testing, we do not have accurate trend data for ELA and Math. However, we consistently scored above the state and district in these areas. We also showed growth as evidenced by moving from a growth rating of average to good on the state report card. We also moved from average to excellent in our absolute rating and were recognized with a Palmetto Silver and Gold Award.

Our highest area of performance has consistently been in Social Studies over the last 3 years. In 2016, 87.6% of our students scored met or above. Math (86.5%) and ELA (83.6%) are not far behind with the number of students met/above. Our African-American student population showed an increasing performance from 76.5% met or exceeding on the 2014 SC Pass Math to 86.4% met or exceeding on the 2016 SC Ready Math for the same group of students. There appears to be a narrowing of the achievement gap between the African-American student subgroup and the white subgroup in science by almost 30%.

For the third consecutive year our school improvement rating, as measured by EVASS for the Teacher Advancement Program, was a five on a scale of 1-5. Our MAP benchmark assessment shows that we are at or above the national scores and are consistently outscoring the schools in our district.

We are fortunate to have a strong teaching staff with community ties, resulting in low teacher turnover. Job satisfaction is evidenced by the SCDE teacher surveys over the last three years that show 100% satisfaction with the school environment. We have four National Board Certified teachers and 68% of our teachers have advanced degrees. Our teachers have written and been awarded SRNS grants, Foundation Grants, and Donors Choose Grant funding to support their efforts in the classroom totaling approximately \$40,000 over the last 3 years. This year we were awarded an EEDA Preparing College and Career Ready Graduates Competitive Grant of \$396,398 over a three- year period to assist at-risk students with both strong academics and real-world problem solving skills. This grant is shared with one other school in our district.

Over the next three years, we hope to continue to build on the strong foundation that has been established at W. E. Parker. We will continue to hire quality teachers who possess the skills and characteristics that have been identified for the Profile of the SC Graduate. Weekly literacy coaching and professional development will continue. Providing teachers with training in the use of technology as an instructional tool in the classroom and training in project-based learning will be a focus as we move our students forward. When our students leave WEP, it is our hope that they will possess world-class skills, life and career characteristics, and can transfer what they have learned to the next level of education and into the working world
