RSM Elementary/Middle met 13 out of 23 objectives for the spring 2011 PASS testing. The objectives included student performance, graduation rate or student attendance, and participation in the state testing program. Extensive work is needed to improve the absolute and growth ratings.

Goal 1:

By spring 2012, 58% of Ridge Spring-Monetta Elementary/Middle school students will score at Met or Exemplary in English/Language Arts and 49% of the students will score at Met or Exemplary in mathematics as measured by Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (PASS). Evidence of Attainment

• The state report card indicates RSM's ELA and Math scores failed to meet the state's performance objectives in 2011.

Strategies for Improvement

- Implementation of literacy model, small group instruction, Common Core State Standards
- Application of interventions for students showing need

Goal 2:

By spring 2012, 100% of our teachers at Ridge Spring-Monetta Elementary/Middle School will maintain highly qualified status as defined by No Child Left Behind.

Evidence of Attainment

The state report card shows classes taught by highly qualified teachers were at 100%.

Goal 3:

By spring 2012, the school stakeholders will indicate satisfaction with the School Learning Environment survey (SLE) through a 82% score, the social and physical environment survey (SPE) with a 75% score and the schoolhome relations survey (SHR) score of 79% as measured by the state report card survey. Evidence of Attainment

The state report card suggests further improvement could be made in the school climate.

Strategies for Improvement

- Implementation of schoolwide expectations
- Evaluation of parent/teacher communiction
