

Achievements, Awards & Recognitions

- FMS received an "A" rating for the 2012-2013 school year on the ESEA/Federal Accountability Rating System.
- One student was named a Duke TIP scholar. The talent search pool is a special group of students who demonstrate a high level of achievement on tests with a ceiling appropriate for their age and grade.
- Three students were named as Junior Scholars. The South Carolina Junior Scholars Program identifies eighth grade students with exceptional academic talent.
- FMS housed the *STEM Early College Academy* program for the first time. This prestigious program will offer a specially designed curriculum track for the most promising students in our district, who began an accelerated track with emphasis in science, technology, engineering and mathematics. At the time of graduation, students will not only have a high school diploma, but also a two year Associate's Degree in Science from Midlands Technical College!
- Latin I CP was offered for the first time at FMS. Students participated through the South Carolina Virtual School Program.
- The SIC began the Elite Ladies Program, whose mission is to establish self respect/self esteem, personal appearance and learning how to set and attain goals.
- The Academic Challenge team participated in the Academic Challenge Festival, where the seventh graders won both of their matches and the eighth graders won one of their matches!
- The Town of Winnsboro and Fairfield were proud to present a 7th grade student with the Arbor Day Essay Award. The student's essay expressed the importance and history of Arbor Day. His encouraging words inspired the citizens of Winnsboro to promote the planting of trees.
- First, second, and third quarter student incentives were earned.
- The student attendance rate for the year has averaged 95+%.
- Ms. Vanese Scott, science teacher, was accepted in the Science P.L.U.S. Institute for the second year in a row!
