## ACT ASPIRE

The ACT Aspire assessment was given to students in grades 3-8 in Spring 2015. Students were assessed in the subject areas of Reading, English, Mathematics and Writing.

### Academic Highlights

- 85 % of the students who are served in child development are able to identify 100 % of their letters.
- 100 % of the students in grades 1-6 demonstrated growth in the areas of reading as measured by Fountas and Pinnell.
- 85.7 % of students in 6th grade scored met or exemplary during the spring administration of Measures of Academic Progress (MAP).
- 100 % of the student served in K-1 intervention demonstrated growth in the areas of reading and math.

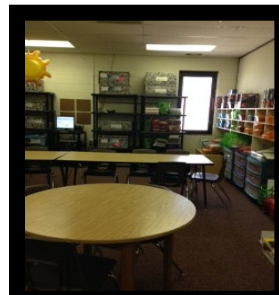
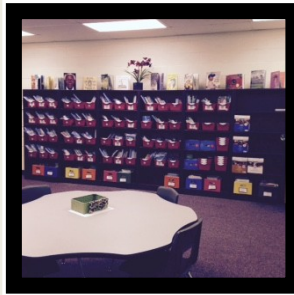
