- Purchase research based instructional materials to be used by teachers and the Instructional Coach.
- Provide parenting workshops led by the Instructional Coach and/or others qualified in the areas of Math and ELA.
- Teachers will provide students enrichment and remediation in the areas of Math and ELA before, during, and after school.

Professional Development

Provide professional staff development in the area of Mathematics and English Language Arts to meet the needs of disabled students.

- Grade Level Meetings
- Contract the services of Clemson University's Math Department for Common Core Decoded Math Workshops
- Data disaggregated through team meetings with all teachers to include SCPASS and MAP assessments.
- Bi-monthly meetings with administrators to review current data.
- Meeting with Mr. Titus Duren to analyze data.
