The purpose of Warrenville Elementary is to provide students with the skills necessary to become college and career ready by setting rigorous standards in academic performance and high expectations for student behavior in a safe a secure learning environment.

SIC GOALS

By spring 2022, 97% of teachers, 95% of students, and 90% of parents will indicate satisfaction with the learning environment; 98% of teachers, 96% of students, and 90% of parents will indicate satisfaction with the social and physical environment; 90% of teachers, 89% of students, and 87% of parents will indicate satisfaction with school-home relations as measured by the state report card.

By spring of 2022, Warrenville Elementary students will demonstrate proficiency by meeting the following targets on SC Ready ELA and math: ELA LEVEL 2: 77.1% ELA LEVEL 2: 77.1% MATH LEVEL 2: 80.8%

By Spring of 2022, the average observation rating on the Aiken County Public School District's Instructional Framework Observation Tool 2.0 will increase by 0.06% in the following areas: Instructional Plans, Learning Objective, Activator, Concept/Skill Development, Guided Practice, Transition, Independent Practice, and Closure.

ACHIEVEMENT

Strategies Gold (4K), Fountas and Pinnell (5K-2nd), and NWEA Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) Reading and Math Assessments (1st- 5th) are administered each year during fall, winter, and spring. Formative and summative assessments are administered throughout the school year. Teachers use these data points to assist them in differentiating instruction. This information is used to plan instructional strategies to target and support areas of academic weakness and enrich academic strengths. Teachers also monitor student progress to develop goals with students. Goal setting with students plays an integral part in results on district and state assessments.

Based on MAP Reading and Math testing data, we feel a majority of our students will be successful during SC Ready standardized testing.
