By spring of 2023, Warrenville Elementary students will demonstrate proficiency by meeting the following targets on SC Ready ELA and math:

ACHIEVEMENT

Strategies Gold (4K), Fast Bridge (5K-2nd), and NWEA Measures of Academic Progress Reading and Math Assessments (1st- 5th) are administered each year during fall, winter, and spring. Formative and summative assessments are administered throughout the school year. Teachers use these data points to assist them in differentiating instruction. This information is used to plan instructional strategies to target and support areas of academic weakness and enrich academic strengths. Teachers also monitor student progress to develop goals with students. Goal setting with students plays an integral part in results on district and state assessments.

Based on MAP Reading and Math testing data, we feel a majority of our students will be successful during SC Ready standardized testing. During the 2024 spring administration of NWEA MAP, 53% of our students met their projected growth target in reading and 50% of our students met their projected growth target in math.
