The purpose of Warrenville Elementary School is to provide students with the skills necessary to become college and career ready by setting rigorous standards in academic performance and high expectations for student behavior in a safe and secure learning environment.

Purpose of the Report

“This Report is issued by the Warrenville Elementary School Improvement Council in accordance with South Carolina law to share information on the school’s progress in meeting various goals and objectives, the work of the SIC, and other accomplishments during the school year.”

SIC Annual Goals

We are excelling toward reaching our instructional goals as measured by our state assessment. Our goals in grades 3-5 are: ELA 84%; Math 75.9%; Social Studies 73.5%; Science 76.9%.

By the spring of 2015, the school will maintain a 100% highly qualified teaching staff as defined by No Child Left Behind. Presently, 100% of our staff is highly qualified.

Measure of Academic Progress (MAP testing) is administered each year in cycles: fall, winter, and spring. Teachers use MAP scores to assist them in differentiating instruction. This information is used to plan instructional strategies to target and support areas of academic weakness and continue to enrich academic strengths. Teachers at Warrenville track student MAP data in data folders which are the building blocks of tracking student data school wide. This process plays an integral part in determining how to achieve outstanding results on the PASS assessment.

Typically each year we provide parents with established projections on state assessments. This year we are participating in a totally new assessment, ACT Aspire. This assessment has many new components. We will use the 2015 results for a new base line data to make projections in the future.

Based on Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) testing data we feel a majority of our students will be successful on the ACT Aspire Standardized testing.

Warrenville Elementary is a Title I school located in a small former textile community. The total enrollment is 449. The student body consists of 45% females, 55% males (56% Caucasian, 31% African-American, 8% Hispanic, and 5% other). Warrenville has a poverty rate of 74.85%
