# 2020-2021 Annual School Summary Report

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The purpose of Warrenville Elementary is to provide students with the skills necessary to become college and career ready by setting rigorous standards in academic performance and high expectations for student behavior in a safe a secure learning environment.

### **SIC GOALS**

By spring 2021, 97% of teachers, 90% of students, and 90% of parents will indicate satisfaction with the learning environment; 97% of teachers, 95% of students, and 90% of parents will indicate satisfaction with the social and physical environment; 90% of teachers, 89% of students, and 86% of parents will indicate satisfaction with school-home relations as measured by the state report card.

By spring of 2021, Warrenville Elementary students will demonstrate proficiency by meeting the following targets on SC Ready ELA and math:

ELA LEVEL 2: 76.2% ELA LEVEL 3: 42.2% MATH LEVEL 2: 80.1% MATH LEVEL 3: 45.8%

By spring 2021, the average observation rating on the Aiken County Public School District's Instructional Framework Observational Tool 2.0 will increase by 0.06% in the following areas: Instructional Plans, Learning Objective, Activator, Concept/Skill Development, Guided Practice, Transition, Independent Practice, and Closure.

## **ACHIEVEMENT**

Strategies Gold (4K), Fountas and Pinnell (5K-2<sup>nd</sup>), and Houghton Mifflin Harcourt Reading and Math Inventories (2<sup>nd</sup>- 5<sup>th</sup>) are administered each year during fall, winter, and spring. District benchmark assessments are administered to grades 2<sup>nd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> at the end of each quarter. Teachers use these data points to assist them in differentiating instruction. This information is used to plan instructional strategies to target and support areas of academic weakness and enrich academic strengths. At Warrenville, teachers track student benchmark data in data folders which are the building blocks of tracking student data school wide. This process plays an integral part in determining how to achieve outstanding results on district and state assessments.

According to spring Houghton Mifflin Harcourt Reading Inventory and Math Inventory data, our 2<sup>nd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade students increased their reading proficiency by 22% and their math proficiency by 41%. Based on HMH RI and MI testing data, we feel a majority of our students will be successful during SC Ready standardized testing.
