The purpose of Warrenville Elementary School is to provide students with the skills necessary to become college and career ready by setting rigorous standards in academic performance and high expectations for student behavior in a safe and secure learning environment.

SIC Annual Goals

By the spring of 2014, 84% of the students in grades 3-5 will score Met or Exemplary on the PASS ELA subtest and 75.9% of the students will score Met or Exemplary on the PASS Math subtest. Our school report card indicates that 82.5% scored Met or Exemplary on the PASS ELA subtest and 74.4% scored Met or Exemplary on the PASS Math subtest.

By the spring of 2014, the school will maintain a 100% highly qualified teaching staff as defined by No Child Left Behind. Presently, 100% of our staff is highly qualified.

Measure of Academic Progress (MAP testing) is administered each year in cycles: fall, winter, and spring. Teachers use MAP scores to assist them in differentiating instruction. This information is used to plan instructional strategies to target and support areas of academic weakness and continue to enrich academic strengths. Teachers at Warrenville track student MAP data in data folders which are the building blocks of tracking student data school wide. This process plays an integral part in determining how to achieve outstanding results on the PASS assessment.
