On average, fifty percent or greater of Theodore Lester Elementary students in each homeroom teachers' class did not meet grade level reading proficiency. In addition to enhanced learning students who live in the Theodore Lester Elementary school zone, Lester also houses most of the elementary students autism population for Florence School District One. Enhanced or Special Education learners made up an average of roughly 30% of Lester's 2017 tested student population. Lester administration and the district's Exceptional Needs Department is working collaboratively to determine a better accountability process for sharing out-of-zone student test scores.

Goals for the Year
