ACT / ACT WorkKeys

The WorkKeys system from the ACT is designed to identify students' work skills. Through this assessment, students become more aware of their strengths within the workplace and what jobs/career paths may be best for them. Each junior will take the ACT and WorkKeys this school year.

How we Achieve Goals

In order to **increase student achievement on standardized tests**, West Florence employs USA Testprep, Inc., an online preparation resource; MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) testing, an instrument to identify student weaknesses and lead teacher planning to remediate as needed; Gifted/ Talented and Advanced Placement courses; tutoring in English and math; and E-book readers/iPads in selected classes.

We prepare students for the technological skills required by modern society by having Integrated Business Applications/Digital Multimedia/Imaging Web Page Design classes. We have wireless access throughout campus with 7 computer labs (including 2 laptop labs and 1 iMac computer lab). Interactive whiteboards are in nearly all classrooms, and we have 4 Personal Smart Response systems for classroom use. We have iPods/iPod Touches/Mini iPads available for classroom use as well. Our math department has TI-Nspire calculators for use with the TI (Texas Instruments) Navigational System (wireless communication between student and teacher calculators).

To reduce the student retention rate, West Florence now has academic advisors for all students, career academies to help focus students, and our media center has extended hours during peak times of year. We have such programs as APEX (credit recovery throughout the school year and/or summer), as well as attendance recovery for students. We utilize the Drop-Out Prevention Initiative, Graduate Florence Academy, FSD1 and South Carolina Virtual Schools, and dual-credit classes. The BRIDGE Program is a three-week enrichment program for selected rising ninth graders. The focus of this program is to help students with English and math skills.

We assist students with career choices in preparation for the workplace or post-secondary education. Each student has a four-year Individual Graduation Plan (IGP), individual career counseling and career interest surveys, career fairs, and Career Development Facilitators (CDFs). We have College Application Day and onsite college representatives. West Florence offers career classes, internships, and shadowing. We also administer the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery test). The WorkKeys system from the ACT is designed to promote better skills for the workplace for students.
