- Provide services to students with specific needs.
 - Occupational therapy, speech therapy, and behavioral health counseling are provided ed to students.
 - Students with English as a second language receive service from an ESOL teacher.
- Provide students with an enriched curriculum.
 - Students in grades 3–6 participate in an accelerated math program called Math Super Stars.
 - Students earn ribbons for mastering all of their math facts, learning their "Lightning Words," and earning points in Reading Renaissance.
 - Students participated in "The Battle of the Books" after reading all of the SC Book Award Nominees. They brought home the trophy for the second year in a row.
 - Third grade students participated in the Math Master's district competition and won the "1st Place Team Award."



The hard work of the Royall teachers and students continue to bridge the achievement gap and make annual yearly progress by scoring high on the state test.
