How We're Meeting This Goal:

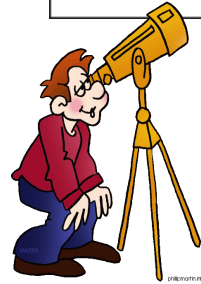
- Implementation of School-wide Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS)
- Incentives for students that exhibit good character and positive behavior:
 - Princi-Pals chosen monthly by teachers; students have refreshments while the principal reads a story
 - Terrific Kids program is sponsored by Golden K Kiwanis
 - Character Coupons earned for good character and are read during afternoon announcements
 - Quarterly Skate Night invitations for students with no discipline referrals or self assessments
 - Rewards for Perfect Attendance and Honor Roll
 - Bus of the Month
 - Reading Renaissance incentives for meeting goals and earning points
 - Key Chain tokens for positive behavior. Bully prevention lessons for kindergarten – grade 3
- Steps to Respect, Level 2, a bully prevention program for grades 4 & 5
- Steps to Respect, Level 3, a bully prevention program for grade 6
- Community and FMU volunteers work with students in reading, math, science, and social studies; they also serve as role models
- Classroom lessons
- FDTC and FMU students along with community volunteers reinforce instruction, model positive behavior, and mentor students
- Faith-based Initiative volunteers serve as mentors
- All students participate in at least one service-learning project during the year

The mission of Timrod School is to prepare our students for a lifetime of learning through human relationships, appropriate curriculum, and the use of technology, in an environment conducive to learning.

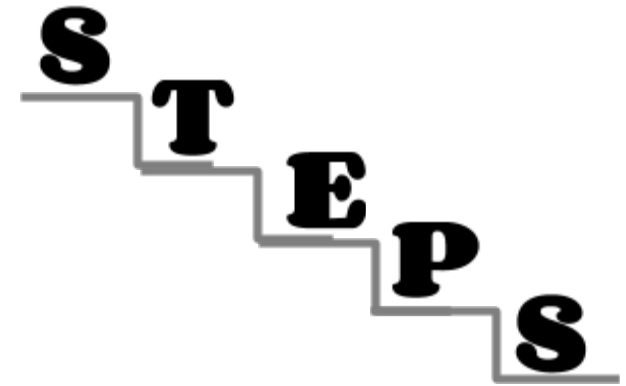
A Message from the Principal

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

- **Art Club/Horizons**: Students develop natural creative skills by executing artwork and audition for the FSD1 summer program.
- **BOB**: Battle of the Books: Students read and participate in challenges with Bob groups from other schools.
- **Brigadiers**: Students take responsibility for monitoring assigned areas during arrival and dismissal time each day.
- **Cheer Club**: Students focus on fitness along with teamwork.
