Our school is implementing many effective practices and programs that we would like to share with you, such as:

- Extended Day Academy is one of our afterschool programs for students to gain additional academic support and participate in educational activities.
- Gems in STEM is our afterschool program for female students in grades K through 6 to learn about Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math through hands-on activities.
- Project REACH is the elementary program for academically gifted and talented children, serving students in grades 3 through 6.
 Students attend REACH by grade level one day a week.
- Reading Recovery is a short-term intervention for 1st graders having extreme difficulty with early reading and writing. Specially trained teachers work individually with students in daily 30 minute lessons lasting 12 to 20 weeks
- Lexia and Dreambox are Computer-Based
 Instructional programs. Lexia is a technology
 based literacy program for students in grades
 pre-K-5 that provides differentiated literacy
 instruction for students. Dreambox is an online
 math program that provides rigorous
 individualized lessons for students.
