Academic Programs

Our school is implementing many effective practices and programs that we would like to share with you, such as:

- Golden Eagle University is parenting class available to all guardian of students. The program, Tools for Teachers, equips parents with the skills to foster a respectful, cooperation household while maintaining loving relationships with their children. Evening sessions are held throughout the school year, and participating guardians are invited to a graduation ceremony upon completion of all sessions.
- Reading Recovery is a short-term intervention for 1st graders having extreme difficulty with early reading and writing. Specially trained teachers work individually with students in daily 30 minute lessons lasting 12 to 20 weeks
- Lexia and Dreambox are Computer-Based Instructional programs. Lexia is a technology based literacy program for students in grades pre-K-5 that provides differentiated literacy instruction for students. Dreambox is an online math program that provides rigorous individualized lessons for students.
- 4th Grade math tutoring program targets fourth-grade students. Students receive additional support in math. Data used from universal screeners guides the instruction students receive. This program is facilitated by the Curriculum Coordinator and Technology Coach, Ms. Davis.
- Moving Up Academyis an after-school program targets third-grade students. Students receive additional support in reading, writing, and math. This program is facilitated by the music teacher, Mr. Jackson.
- 3rd Grade tutoring is a Tutoring Program at WGE that was developed to support students in Phonics using Orton-Gilliham's Curriculum and Strategies. The students work in a small group setting after school to focus on their targeted needs. Universal Screeners were used to select students for this program. This program is facilitated by Mrs. Pressley, Literacy Coach.
