Building SIC Vision and Purpose

When Hannah– Pamplico High School Improvement Council (SIC) began meeting at the start of the school year, one group-awareness was that the SIC had been out of state-compliance in recent years. The group committed to establishing membership, by-laws, and meeting schedules in order to partner with integrity in the work of school improvement. Throughout the school year, the SIC has been active this year in a number of initiatives to support continuous improvement at Hannah Pamplico High School (HPHS) and Florence School District Two (FSD2). As the district went through Cognia evaluation this year, the SIC contributed to mission and vision and belief statement revisions. As the SIC looked at the HPHS report card data from last year, the SIC set several goals:

- Increase school-to-home communication
- Increase stakeholder participation in school report card surveys
- Build stakeholder understandings about the school report card data and factors that influence report card ratings
- Support school initiatives related to graduation and college and career readiness

Because of SIC involvement, the school increased its parent notifications regarding attendance and grades. These initiatives served to improve student attendance and passage rates. Suggested student incentives resulted in a quarterly recognition of students for honor roll and high-attendance and monthly recognition of students of the month. A local restaurant owner agreed to sponsor the student of the month initiative. SIC feedback regarding online and dual-credit options resulted in HPHS increasing its flexibility of in-house offerings and keeping parents better informed as to student progress. Some of the measurable results of this work are shared on page 2 of this document.

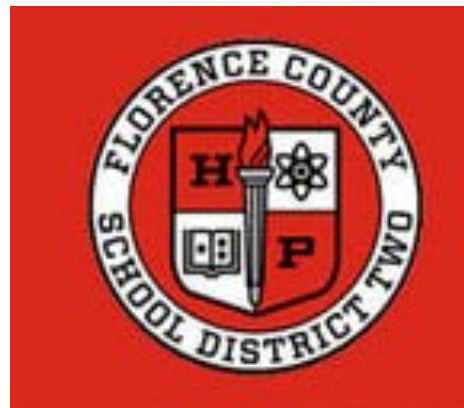

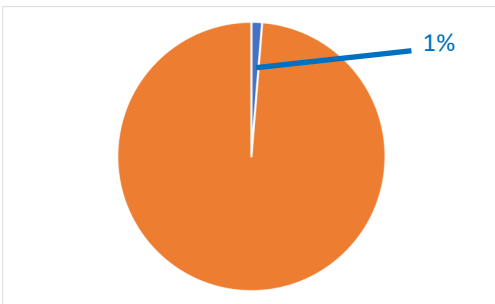

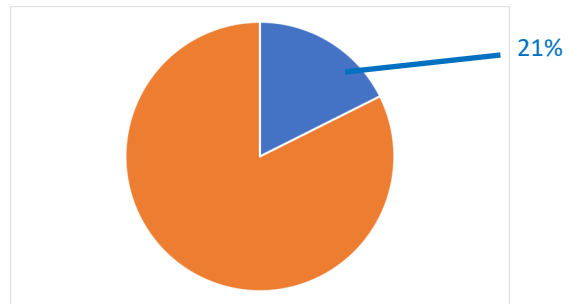
Some SIC Results...

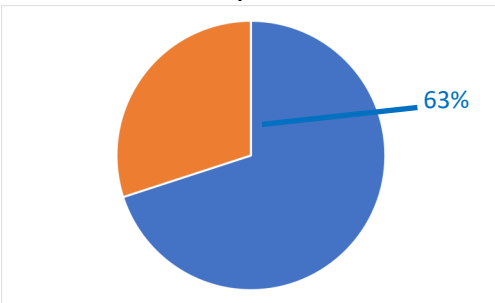
Parent Participation in 2023



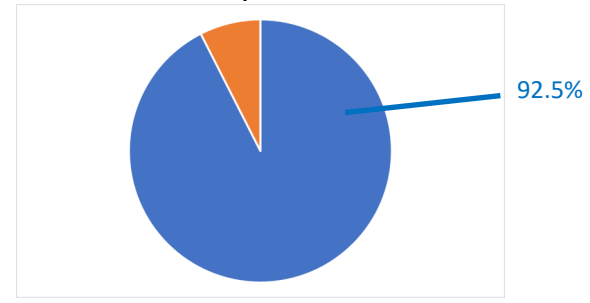
Parent Participation in 2024



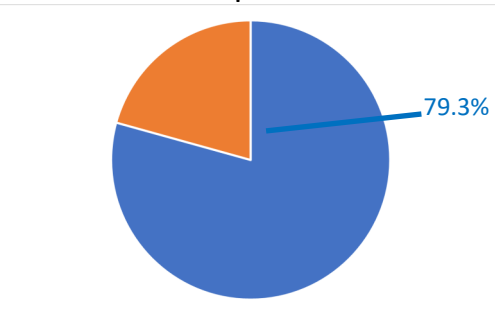
Student Participation in 2023



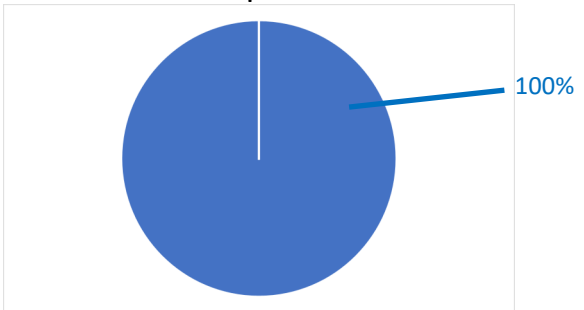
Student Participation in 2024

As a comprehensive high school with on-site career technical education certification offerings, HPHS values career-readiness. SIC focused attention on, and helped clarify avenues for students becoming college and career ready. Part of this work involved contributing to the writing of a WIOA-funded Local Workforce Grant for student internships. All of this contributed to another area of notable improvement for the school in the 2023-2024 school year which has been an increase in the number of graduates who have earned the status of College and/or Career Ready. The chart below reflects that increase to-date over last year.
