## Improvement Results

Hannah-Pamplico Elementary/Middle School shows continuous progress towards increasing student achievement. In the spring of 2016, students in grades 3-8 were tested using SCREADY. This was a new state test being used. 27.3% of HPEM students Exceeded or Met for English Language Arts. 31.1% of students tested Exceed or Met the criteria on the Math Assessment.

## Strategies for Student Achievement

- Staff Development Training: Content specific and research based.
- Our school is an official Leader in Me school.
- One-to-one initiative for computers in the hands of students in grades 3-8 for greater opportunities to individualize instruction.
- Forty-five Smart Panels added into classrooms during the 2016-2017 school year.
- Classroom iPads available to students in grades K-2.
- Daily integration of Smart Panels and/or Promethean Boards and one-to-one student devices.
- Reading Interventionist for grades K-2.
- Wireless access on buses in the community.
- Lucy Caulkins reading units of study curriculum are being implemented K-5.
- Read to Succeed- School-wide reading coach.
- Single Gender Grouping for students in grades 6-8.
- 4K and Montessori programs were added to our school during the 2016-2017 school year.
- Implementation of Project Lead the Way
- Added a Career Development Facilitator.
- Pee Dee Mental Health Counselor onsite.



## Great Things Are Happening

- Many teachers are beginning the process of acquiring advanced degrees through Coker College, Francis Marion University, or Coastal Carolina University.
- Teachers are gaining Montessori certification.
- Read to Succeed required certification classes are being taken by teachers.
- Teachers have received classroom donations through Donor's Choose.
- A teacher received a field trip grant from Target.
- The Special Educational Department received a State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) grant.
