- Certified Reading Interventionist for grades 1st through 5th. A certified Math Interventionist for grades 3-4.
- Four middle school interventionists for reading and math.
- Fourth year of implementing iReady testing to increase and monitor student achievement.
- Read to Succeed- School-wide reading coach.
- Literacy Lab for students in traditional classes grades 1-3.
- 5th Grade Montessori programs were added to our school during the 2021-2022 school year.
- School-wide Leadership Day for students to celebrate the goals they have met.
- 90-minute ELA blocks in grades K-6.
- Continued implementation of Project Lead the Way Launch and Gateway.
- School-wide goal incentives.
- School-wide Social-Emotional Screener.
- Mental Health Counselor onsite.

Continuous Improvement

The following data was calculated comparing the 2021-2022 Fall and Spring iReady assessment results. The results are grouped into tiers of instruction. Tier I students perform well with in-class core instruction. Tier II students benefit from small group targeted instruction, and Tier III students need intensive individual attention.

The goal is to move students from Tier 3 (At Risk), which is shown in red, to Tier 2, yellow. With target instruction Tier 2 students will progress to Tier 1, green.

Overall, our K-8 students achieved a median Typical Growth score of 56% out of 100%. The median percent progress towards Typical Growth is the average annual growth for a student at their grade and placement level.



Overall, K-8 students improved from 20% of students in Tier 1 to 42%, 37% in Tier 2 to 33%, and 43% of students in Tier 3 to 25% in Reading.



In Math, students improved from 11% to 38% of students in Tier 1, 45% to 42% in Tier 2 and 44% to 20% in Tier 3.
