Strategies for Student Achievement

- Lucy Caulkins reading units of study curriculum are being implemented K-6.
- Read to Succeed- School-wide reading coach.
- Single Gender Grouping for students in grades 6-8.
- 2nd Grade Montessori programs were added to our school during the 2018-2019 school year.
- K-2 Montessori Education Week program.
- 90 minute ELA blocks added in grades K-6.
- Continued implementation of Project Lead the Way Launch and Gateway.
- Pee Dee Mental Health Counselor onsite.



Great Things Are Happening

- Many teachers are continuing the process of acquiring advanced degrees through Coker College, Francis Marion University, or Coastal Carolina University.
- Partnered with Big John's, Raider's Station, Lula Roe with Jodi and Holly, Sweet Tea, and IGA to raise money for school activities.
- Teachers are gaining Montessori certification and advanced degrees.
- Teachers are taking part in a Text Dependent Analysis professional development sponsored by the SC Department of Education.
- Read to Succeed required certification classes are being taken by teachers.
- Teachers have received classroom donations through Donor's Choose.
- #JustaChicken author visit from Preston Thorne and Langston Moore.
- The Special Educational Department received a State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) grant that helps fund iReady progress monitoring.
