

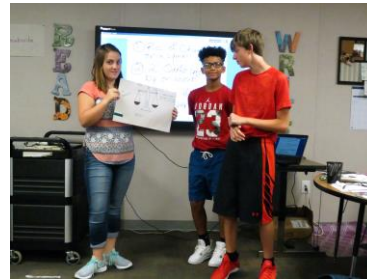
School Achievements
